WELCOME & INTRODUCTIONS:

Called to order at 6:32 pm

Meeting called to order by the Chairperson, Mina Kern, welcomed attendees and introduced CAC members, district staff and administrators, and acknowledged parents. The Chair reviewed the agenda, meeting format and structure, membership procedures and process for providing public comment.

District-Wide Goals for Special Education-Superintendent Cindy Marten

- -Nov 10 LCAP Update (Can be found at https://www.sandiegounified.org/what-lcap Nov. 10-Quarterly Update): Slide 21 "Students with Disabilities experience the lowest attendance rate, highest chronic absenteeism rate, highest suspension/expulsion rates, and represent the majority of Long-Term English Learners".
 - -Using multi department approach to answer questions around the 4 target areas How do our current organization structure improve learning, how do we create an environment that supports students attending every day, how do we create an environment that will reduce suspensions or expulsion, does out data support a pattern that suggests a group of students is at a higher risk of failure?
 - Proven strategies to address these: 1. Enhance systems for tracking and monitoring; 2. Mine the discipline data for what works and doesn't at school level; 3. Implement the practical strategies.
 - Subgroups are no longer working in isolation but working across departments.
 - Share singular vision, adopting a common approach, common language, coordinating the effort and maintaining a sense of each department's work.
 - Next quarterly update what did we implement and then is there a coherent district approach to addressing each of these areas.
- -Goals for Special Education Department & what should we expect to see & how to measure success
 - Steady outcomes, what is our current level of practice, and what are the recommended actions that come out of the study; at the end of the year expect to see data to indicate that referrals are being handled according to best practice; multiple data points: quarterly updates, monitor and act to reduce trends, if the trends don't reduce we'll be able to identify those strategies that work and those that don't and adjust accordingly; will look at department and school data, observations, instructional meetings, etc.
- How will the Superintendent support the Special Education Department on meeting their goals:
 - Director & executive director as active members of the instructional team;
 - Focus on instruction;
 - Will use her voice as an advocate for students with disabilities.
- Recap of Learning Cycles.
- Discussion of educational equity for students with disabilities.
- After quarterly report given to board on Special Education updates, the report will be given to the CAC.
- Coherence and collaborative conversations are a priority at all levels.

- Would like to think about setting a goal of instituting best practices for IEP meetings.

- How is the Special Education Department working toward department goals: site meetings focused on what are we doing at all levels of special education including early childhood through high school; goal of increasing number of young adults with disabilities employed by SDUSD; etc.
- On track for a Spring pilot for new IEP system with full implementation in the Fall of 2016-Special Education Automation Software (SEAS).
