## ICOC Walk-Thru

The ICOC walked through the Creative Performing Media Arts (CPMA) Middle School, on March 7, 2013 to observe Prop. S work underway. Attendees were: Scott Thomason (Principal CPMA), Don Webb (Director Construction Management), Gary Stanford (Director Program Management), Regina Rega (Senior Project Manager), Dave Koepecke (Project Manager), Rick Mortazavi (Construction Manager), William Ponder (ICOC Member), Kim Schoettle (ICOC Member), Michael Magallanes (ICOC Member), and Larry Goshorn (ICOC Consultant).

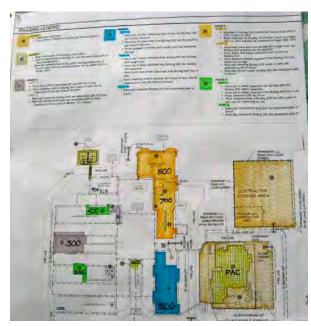
CPMA is a magnet school with about 928 students in grades 6-8. Walk-Thru attendees observed ongoing work on the Whole Site Modernization (WSM) and Performing Arts Center (PAC)

projects. WSM work included modernization of the Kitchen and conversion of covered locker areas into Food Kiosks. These projects are being accomplished through a single construction contract awarded in June 2012 for \$19,708,399. The contract is about 27% complete with a change order rate below 1% thanks to an initial credit change order. Construction of the PAC is 30% complete and is expected to finish in about 6 months. Sequencing requirements incorporated into the contract reduced the need for interim classroom space by dividing the work into 6 phases; construction is currently in 3<sup>rd</sup> phase.

The 4<sup>th</sup> phase calls for renovations of classroom building 500. The 5<sup>th</sup> phase will renovate the shower/locker rooms, cafeteria, auditorium, band and coral areas during summer break.

Contract completion is scheduled for February 2014.



Walk-thru attendees met at the front entrance for a brief description of on-going work before proceeding to building 300. Classrooms in this building will accommodate deaf and hard of hearing (DHH) students including kitchen and bathroom facilities. The group also viewed the former covered locker area in building 400 that is being converted into a food kiosk.

The group then visited the PAC construction site. This is the first project to be designed using building information modeling (BIM) — moving forward all new buildings will use BIM which digitally models the building including all structural and mechanical

components in 3-dimensions to avoid construction conflicts and

permanently document as-built conditions.



Heating and cooling in the PAC theater will be airflow system

airflow system that ventilates through the floor of the seating area. ADA ramps in the front and around the building will accommodate entrances at the various levels necessitated by the elevated theater seating. The PAC building includes shop areas for stage preparation; the stage is easily accessible from these areas. Placement of the PAC building provides for on-site pick-

up/drop-off for district busses (currently 21 busses used/needed), both permanently and during construction.

The original construction budget for the combined WSM and PAC contract was \$19,034,448 (refer to attached Construction Management Report), and the initial contract award amount was \$19,708,399, which is 3.5% over budget. Pending contract changes, including substantial deductive changes, are projected to lower the total contract to \$19,333,358, which is only 1.6%



over budget. Other construction contracts have been coming in under the construction budget, (refer to attached bid history display extracted from the May 2013 Cost Controls Report) and have generated sufficient surplus to fund the budget overage without impacting planned funding for future work.

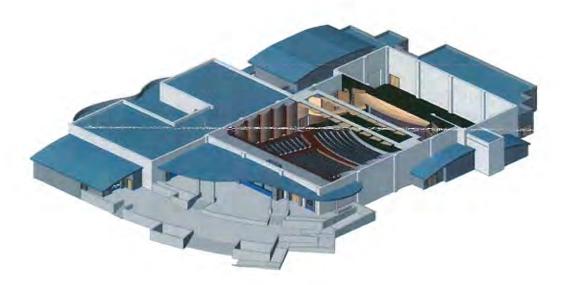
